Sequoia Stamp Club's 75th Anniversary Celebration by Kristin Patterson

The Sequoia Stamp Club's 75th Anniversary Celebration will be held Saturday, September 17 from 1:30 to 5 pm. The Official Ceremony will be at 3:30 pm.

On September 30, 1947, a small group of enthusiastic stamp collectors met in the Recreation Craft Room at the Redwood City's Fire House #2 (now Station #10) at 2190 Jefferson Avenue on the corner of Myrtle Street, to form the Sequoia Stamp Club. They elected Mr. Louis Weiss as president and set the annual club dues at \$1. The membership voted unanimously to make Alfred "Red" Morton their first Honorary Member for his untiring and splendid efforts in promoting the formation of the club and the Junior Stamp Club. Hired in 1937, Mr. Morton was Redwood City's first recreation director. The Recreation Department graciously furnished stencils, postcards, and supplies for SSC meeting notices.

Mounting interest in philately and stimulating programs increased the membership to over 80 individuals, causing the craft room at the Fire House to bulge at its seams. In March 1950, it became necessary to transfer the club meetings and events to a larger venue; the YMCA building at 1234 Brewster Avenue in Redwood City.

In 1956, the completion of the new YMCA building at 1445 Hudson Street (still there in 2022) provided an even better facility which further enhanced the activities of the club. However, with the increased popularity of the YMCA, as well as continuing growth of the club membership, another move was necessary. In 1962, the club began meeting in the Friendship Room of the American Savings and Loan Association of California at 1615 Woodside Road. This was an excellent meeting

place, but there was a drawback. It was on the second floor and some of the older members found climbing the stairs too difficult, so in January 1965 a move to the Veterans Memorial Building at 1455 Madison Avenue took place.

Further growth dictated another move. In January 1967, the club moved to the new RC Community Activities Building at 1400 Roosevelt Avenue, where they comfortably settled and still meet today. They also hold an annual PENPEX Stamp Show at the same building.

The members have always enjoyed well-rounded philatelic programs, including exhibitions, lectures, film and slide shows, speakers, sales circuits, live and silent auctions, and active discussions. Let us not forget the trading, penny boxes, spot sales, quizzes, and more. The inherent interest and enterprise of philatelists, coupled with a demonstrated spirit of cooperation among members, has resulted in making the Sequoia Stamp Club one of the liveliest and the largest stamp club in the Bay Area.

Our upcoming celebration is free to all stamp collectors and enthusiasts. We will have free raffle drawings for \$150 in stamps to \$150 bottles of wine. Each attendee will receive a raffle ticket as they enter the party. But everyone can increase their chances of winning by getting an additional raffle ticket for dressing in 1947 attire (the year the club was formed) or partaking in the many free games i.e. Philatelic bingo, Corn hole, Shoot the Moon, and others. There will be a free Photo Booth that will immediately print your photo on a postcard for mailing and more.

We do not want to forget refreshments, philatelic exhibits, a bid table with 12 stamp lots for sale to the highest bidders, engaging conversation, and lots of happy philatelists that will make this an event to remember. Please join us.

These stamps celebrate five iconic U.S. automobiles — the 1969 Ford Mustang Boss 302, the 1970 Dodge Challenger R/T, the 1969 Chevrolet Camaro Z/28, the 1967 Mercury Cougar XR-7 GT and the 1969 AMC Javelin SST. The bold and dramatic artwork, painted with oils on panel, captures the energy and mystique of pony cars.

John Joseph Pavalasky August 22, 1941 - July 19, 2022



Sacramento, California -John J. Pavalasky was born August 22, 1941 in Delcarbon, Huerfano, CO, a Calumet Fuel Company town to which his grandfather immigrated from Poland in the 1920's as a coal miner. His parents, John Tony and Ione Edith Pavalasky, moved their family to Pueblo, CO where John attended Centennial High School and played varsity football. Shortly after graduating in 1959, he enlisted in the Air Force. While stationed at Hamilton AFB, CA he fell in love with his future wife, Katie, who was also stationed there. John was deployed to Turkey, while Katie to the other end of the world. They thought they'd never see each other again. Both were honorably discharged, miraculously reunited, and were married in San Francisco, CA in 1966.

John and Katie moved to Sacramento, CA in 1967, and John began working for the State of California -Franchise Tax Board, while earning his BS in Accounting from California State University - Sacramento and raising four daughters. John spent nearly 50 years at FTB as a legislative analyst and federal tax conformity specialist, and appeared before the Legislature regularly. He was held in highest esteem for his depth of knowledge and ability to explain difficult concepts in simple terms.

John and Katie shared a passion for philately since childhood, and joined the



Sacramento Philatelic Society in 1969. John was editor of The Prospector for many years, the trading circuit's buyer, served on the SPS Board, and was its Treasurer for over 20 years.

John was an avid reader, he could not pass up a used bookstore! A lively conversationalist, he knew something about everything, and a lot about computers. He adored our national parks, especially Yosemite, and became an avian photographer. He loved movies and often quoted his favorite line as, "One ping only, Vasily!"

John is warmly remembered for his big smile and hearty laugh, deep humility and stoicism, honesty and integrity, keen mind and intense curiosity, dry and punny humor and most of all, his endless devotion to his wife, Katie, for 56 years. He was Micky to her Minnie.

John is preceded by his parents and sister, Louise Freeark of Pueblo, CO. John is survived by his loving wife, Katie; four daughters: Christine, Suzanne, Kathy and Mary; seven grandchildren: Daniel, Laura, Caleb, Andrew, Joshua, Noelle, and Peter; and many nieces and nephews.

The Charles Poetzl SPS Scholarship Awarded by the 2023 SPS Scholarship Board of the Sacramento Philatelic Society P.O. Box 13284 Sacramento, CA 95813

General Information

The Charles Poetzl SPS Scholarship is governed, controlled, and awarded by the SPS Scholarship Board of the Sacramento Philatelic Society (SPS), which was organized in 1961 as a 501 (c) (7) non-profit social organization, and currently has approximately 200 philatelists in the Greater Sacramento metropolitan area. There may be multiple winners of The Charles Poetzl SPS Scholarship. Each scholarship will be in the amount of at least \$1,000, and it is available to any philatelists residing within the Sacramento Philatelic Society membership area, which is the Greater Sacramento metropolitan area, or any philatelists whose parent or grandparent is a member of SPS. The nominee must be at least 17-years old, but not older than 25-years old at the time of nomination. They must be a full-time student in an accredited community college or an accredited four-year college or university by the fall of 2023. Applicants for a repeat scholarship award must use a separate application form and must submit their current academic transcript as proof of satisfactory progress in their educational endeavor. All winners will be presented at the Sacramento Philatelic Society's first meeting in April of 2023.

This form will be evaluated by the SPS Scholarship Board based upon this application, an official transcript of grades, and a 500 word essay. The \$1,000 scholarships will be issued to an accredited college or university upon notification from the registrar of the student's official enrollment in classes for the fall semester of 2023.

Please adhere to the use of this form so that we may judge all applicants fairly. This completed application and your essay and transcript must be submitted to the attention of the SPS Scholarship Board, P. O. Box 13284, Sacramento, CA 95813, by the close of business day, 4 P.M., Thursday, January 5, 2023. Applications will not be accepted after this deadline.

PROSPECTUS

Any exhibitor may enter, regardless of club affiliation or residence.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. All exhibits will be in open competition. Each exhibit will be judged on its overall philatelic merit. There will be five levels of awards with sufficient number of awards placed for distribution by the jury.
- 2. Junior exhibits will be judged separately. Junior exhibits shall be the work of the exhibitor. Juniors must be under 18 years of age.
- 3. A panel of accredited judges will be selected whose decisions will be final.
- 4. SACAPEX frames hold **sixteen (16)** 8 ½" x 11" pages. Oversize cards or sheets will be accepted for competition only with the permission of the exhibit chairman.
- 5. Each exhibit must be the property of the exhibitor.
- 6. There is no entry fee for exhibits.
- 7. A synopsis page may also be submitted.
- 8. Adult exhibits must be a minimum of one frame and a maximum of twelve frames.
- 9. Junior exhibits must be a minimum of one frame and a maximum of four frames.
- 10. Entries must be made on the official entry form. Signing the entry form indicates acceptance of all rules and regulations.
- 11. The committee reserves the right to withhold any exhibit for not meeting SACAPEX standards. Previous SACAPEX Gold award winning exhibits may be entered only if new write-ups, and/or new material, have been added. Exhibits not for competition will be accepted only at the discretion of the committee. Submit details well in advance of the closing date.
- 12. Owners must provide their own insurance. All reasonable care will be taken. The sponsoring organization, its officers, members, **SACAPEX** officials, the Scottish Rite Masonic Center, nor any other group or organization shall be liable for any damages to, or loss of, any exhibition material arising from any cause or reason whatsoever. A guard will be on duty during all hours that the premises are open to the public. The Scottish Rite Masonic Center has a security alarm system which is armed when the building is not occupied.
- 13. The exhibitor is responsible for both forwarding and return shipping costs. The exhibits will be returned to the owner in the original packing promptly after the closing date of the show. Return shipping instructions and payment for shipping costs must be included with the entry form. Awards will be mailed prepaid to winners not able to attend the exhibit.
- 14. Personally delivered exhibits will be received by the mounting committee in the lobby of the Scottish Rite Masonic Center on Friday, November 4, 2022 between 5:00 p.m. and 6:30 p.m.(NOTE the EARLIER TIME) Exhibits may be picked up on Sunday, November 6, 2022 after the show closes. No exhibit may be removed from the frames until after the show closes.
- 15. Any questions arising that are not covered by these rules and regulations will be decided by the Exhibit Committee, whose decision shall be final.
