THE LOVE STAMP

On January 19, 2023, in Austin, TX, the US Postal Service issued two new Love Forever stamps commemorating the 50th Anniversary of its ever-popular Love series. The stamps feature a kitten and a puppy resting on a red heart with LOVE in all caps in the background. 200,000,000 stamps were issued in panes of 20, in both traditional die-cut and imperforate formats. The original artwork by Chris Buzelli was painted with oils on wood panels, then scanned and edited digitally by Ethel Kessler, Art Director at the US Postal Service, to create the final images. The US Postal Service chose Austin Pets Alive! to host the First Day of Issue Dedication Ceremony because, as one of the country's largest no-kill pet rescue shelters, "They recently celebrated the 100,000th rescue since their nonprofit was founded - a demonstration of LOVE in action." We love the Love Stamp forever. We hope you love the cachet.

LETTER FROM THE SACAPEX CHAIR


Welcome to Sacapex 2023!


We are pleased that you have come to our stamp show and we hope you enjoy the efforts of the Sacramento Philatelic Society in presenting it for you.
